



Pre- 2019-2020 EKU Merit Scholarship Award Amounts

*All qualified EKU scholarship recipients who were enrolled at EKU **prior** to the 2019-2020 academic year will continue to receive their scholarship support at the following levels:*

EKU Excellence Award

Four-year award of \$52,000. Scholarship of \$6,500 per semester (\$13,000 annually) for up to 8 semesters. If student is not living in University residence halls, the scholarship is reduced to \$3,500 a semester (\$7,000 annually). To retain the scholarship, the student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average and be enrolled full time.

EKU Founders Award

Four-year award of \$40,000. Scholarship of \$5,000 per semester (\$10,000 annually) for up to 8 semesters. If student is not living in University residence halls, the scholarship is reduced to \$3,500 a semester (\$7,000 annually). To retain the scholarship, the student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average and be enrolled full time.

Regents Scholarship

Four-year award of \$24,000. Scholarship of \$3,000 per semester (\$6,000 annually) for up to 8 semesters. If student is not living in University residence halls, the scholarship is reduced to \$2,000 a semester (\$4,000 annually). To retain the scholarship, the student must maintain a 3.0 grade point average and be enrolled full time.

****Students that completed the Governor Scholar Program with a high school grade point average of 3.75 or above and an ACT composite score from 25 to 28 will receive the Regents Scholarship with ALL tuition being covered. Students will automatically receive an updated scholarship award letter after the priority February 1st deadline.**

Presidential Scholarship

Four-year award of \$14,000. Scholarship of \$1,750 per semester (\$3,500 annually) for up to 8 semesters. If student is not living in University residence halls, the scholarship is reduced to \$1,250 a semester (\$2,500 annually). To retain the scholarship, the student must maintain a 2.5 grade point average and be enrolled full time.

****Rogers Scholars with a high school grade point average of 3.4 or above and an ACT composite score of 23 or higher will qualify for the Presidential Scholarship. Students will automatically receive an updated scholarship award letter after the priority February 1st deadline.**
